i-india Summer Evening



Street Child Project Singapore (SCP) held a Summer Evening at Gallery @ Fort Canning in June. The purpose of the event was to raise funds for their current project to build a Girls' Shelter Home in i-india's children's village at Jhag and, just as importantly, to raise further awareness for the charity and the plight of many children in India.

i-india helps over 3,000 children every day in Jaipur. Support from Singapore has funded the building of a home for 52 children and i-india project Australia has enabled the funding of a school for 200 marginalised children, with support from an anonymous donor. Many children attending Ladli, the vocational centre, live on the streets and in the slums - going to Ladli means a safe haven from the streets, an opportunity to go to school, have computer and dance lessons, a hot meal and, if they wish, they can learn jewellery making and tailoring. The children are paid for their work; the permissible age for jewellery making is from 10 years of age. Both boys and girls attend and they are permitted to work for up to 4 hours a day, the children rotate between the programs offered.



The event was a huge success and \$42,000 was raised through ticket sales, raffle tickets and bidding for auction items. The team at Street Child Project Singapore (SCP) and i-india warmly thanked the volunteers and participants for their presence and support on the night together with the sponsors for their generous donations. Without these sponsors, we would not have raised beyond our target for the night. Asian Tigers K. C. Dat donated handbag hooks as a table gift for all the lucky ladies.



AISS Sports Camps

On Saturday, 17 July 2010 the event commenced with the arrival of The Guest of Honour, Minister Gan Kim Yong, Minister for Manpower, who marked the start of this year's Hollywood adventure. Families and friends came together for eight movies and fun activities at Pathlight School in Ang Mo Kio. They had a choice between indoor and outdoor movie screenings of autism related films, general feature films and cartoons. Snacks were prepared and sold by students and volunteers. Merchandise like stationery sets and t-shirts designed by Pathlight students and sold like hot cakes at the Pathlight Mall.

Other activities which attracted lots of interest were beautiful balloon sculptures, glamorous makeovers and face painting. There were plenty of photo opportunities with 16 exotic Ferraris, Lamborghinis and Maseratis and also with movie characters such as Star Wars Storm Troopers, Spongebob, Dora, Pirates of the Caribbean and "Jackie Chan"... It was a great day of fun and excitement indeed!!
